PR and Communications has had a busy year, with most of our efforts devoted to the November 2023 Regular Local Election and the upcoming 2024 Primary Election. In addition, we have mentored a student intern from Santa Fe Prep, a local high school.

The Website: We are contracting with a local website hosting service, Studio X, to move our website from Weebly, and redesign and upgrade our website. See the Administrative Report for details.

We have kept the website up to date with events and election information as needed.

Social Media: We continue to use Facebook (8 plus followers), X (400 plus followers) and Instagram (200 plus followers) to advertise our activities and grow our presence in the community. We are following and being followed by more and more local and state organizations. We were particularly active on social media during the primary and general elections, promoting voting and voter information, including VOTE 411. Board Members have been sharing announcements about the elections and voter information on their local NextDoor accounts, which has been getting a lot of notice from local. We are hoping to start a YouTube channel this year.
