PROGRAM SUMMARY

Voter Services focuses on Voter Access, Voter Information and Civic Engagement for adults and students. Voter Services works closely with PR Communications, VP Stephanie Schlanger.

The Voter Services Program includes the following: (1) Voter Registration and Education (Program Director), (2) Candidate Forums (Coordinator), (3) Voter Guide ((Program Manager), and (4) High School Civic Engagement Project (Program Management Team) and other miscellaneous activities. The Vice President of Voter Services oversees the programs.

ADMINISTRATOR-VP VOTER SERVICES

- Assisted League Day at the Legislature
- Served on Nominating Committee
- Served as a Lobbyist for the State League
- Collated monthly reports submitted by Voter Services Program Directors, Managers, and Coordinators
- Coordinated publications/pamphlets, brochures (including those published by the Santa Fe New Mexican), voter guides, voter registration events for the 2023 Local Election and the 2024 Primary Election and circulated GOTV information, to 77,851 individuals. A total of 178 volunteers assisted in GOTV activities donating a total of 592 volunteer hours.
