## Action and Advocacy, June 2025

- 1. Report on response to our water letter:
  - County Commissioner Camilla Bustamente responded to our letter and recommended that we take a look at what Bernalillo County is doing – appointing an Independent Commission to oversee cross-jurisdictional services like Water, Wastewater, and Well Use. Also mentioned Justin Greene as someone who is very interested in the topic.
  - Discussed the Albuquerque/Bernalillo County Water Utility Authority, which is a cross-jurisdictional decision-making body made up of 3 City Councilors (ALB), 3 County Commissioners (Bern), the Albuquerque Mayor and two non-voting representatives from Los Ranchos. We discussed meeting with one or more of the people from that Board to hear first-hand how it's working.
- 2. Brainstorming questions for meeting with the City Manager
  - Current status of plans for the Wastewater Treatment Plant yes
  - Midtown Plans we may already be current on this
  - Homeless services we may already be current on this
  - Land Use/Code Revision yes (Santa Fe Forward Open House, Sat. June 14<sup>th</sup>, 10-2 in SFCC Higher Ed Center.)
  - Las Estrellas we may already be current on this (pending legal clarification)
  - Activities Regarding Plaza we may already be current on this
- 3. SFPS Mary Ellen
  - Selection of New Superintendent: We don't know why the selection process was so short, but it may have to do with Veronica Garcia's contract ending.
  - We would like an update on the status of the Yazzie Ruling
  - 4. SFCC Marcy
    - SFCC Board had a well-designed day-long Retreat, at which they addressed Strategic Planning, Board and President evaluations, and guidelines for collective bargaining with faculty.
  - 5. Las Estrellas- Jody
    - Jody reported that progress has halted on Las Estrellas because they discovered mistakes were made during the rezoning.

- 6. Santa Fe County- Carol
  - A big issue currently is how the prisoners being released from the County Jail can get in to Santa Fe without walking on the dangerous road.
  - Two "affordable housing" apartment buildings are about to be built, both on the far Southside where there is no public transportation. So renters will have to have cars.
  - County Bond Issues: they are for Capital Improvement projects, with very little flexibility to anything else, like staffing, maintenance, etc.
  - Carol will look into what happens to the unspent funds from prior Bond Issues.
